Principal's Address

Dear Parents and Carers,

We've hit the term running, with some fabulous learning opportunities for our students so far this year... and many more to come!

Hours of Supervision

A friendly reminder that our teachers are on duty from 8.30am until 3.00pm. Students should not be dropped off at school before 8.30am. Thank you for your cooperation with this.

Absences

By law, children are expected to be at school each day unless they are sick. All absences from school must be explained in writing within 7 days, include the dates of the absence/s and must contain the reason. Absences without a justified reason continue to remain unjustified absences. Please contact the office if your child is absent for more than 2 days. Exemption applications for leave more than 5 days long are available on our school website or from the office. Should your child be late to school or need to leave early, they must be signed in/out by an adult, with a reason being given for their lateness or for the need to leave early, and the child must be dropped off or picked up at the classroom. Please make appointments outside of school for outside of school hours where possible.

Communication

Strong communication between the home and school is essential in order to provide the best possible learning experiences for your child. The school newsletter contains essential information relating to activities happening at school. It is sent home fortnightly on Wednesdays. There is an option to have your newsletter emailed to save paper – please contact the school office if you would prefer this option. Broke PS uses the Skoolbag app. This is a fantastic up to date source of information. Highly recommended!

We will be using Seesaw to share our learning this year. Further information will be given at the meet the teacher session next week. We will be posting photos and samples of our learning to

share with you through the year.

If you need to speak with your child's class teacher at any time throughout the year, please contact the office to arrange a suitable time.

Where and who do I see in the school - outline for approaching the school

Below are the Guidelines for Approaching our School with the full document available on our school website. These procedures encourage positive interactions between school and home for the benefit of improved student outcomes.

Guidelines for Approaching our School - A parent and community guide for seeking information and expressing concerns.

From time to time parents or other members of the school community may need to approach the school in order to:

- Discuss the progress or welfare of their own child
- Express concern about actions of other students
- Enquire about school policy or practice

These procedures will help solve problems as soon as possible so that a safe and harmonious school environment is maintained. The best results will always flow from people working together. These guidelines aim to:

- provide a guide in order that concerns are dealt with in an open and fair manner
- ensure that the rights of students, parents and staff are respected and upheld
- support sensitivity and confidentiality
- help reach an agreed solution

Trying to talk to teachers when they are preparing for their teaching day, managing children or engaged in another conversation is not fair on you or your child. We want to give every parent our full attention at the appropriate time.

CONCERN	APPROPRIATE ACTION
The academic progress of your own child	Directly contact the child's teacher either by note, school email, by phone or in person to arrange a mutually suitable time to discuss any issues.
The welfare of your own child	For minor issues directly contact your child's teacher to clarify information. For more serious concerns, contact school office or school email. State nature of concern and arrange a suitable time to talk with class teacher or appropriate staff member. To convey information about change of address, telephone number, emergency contact, custody details, health issues and other related issues please contact the office.
Actions of other students	Contact the class teacher for a classroom problem. Contact the class teacher or the Principal (in that order) for playground problems. AT NO TIME SHOULD A PARENT APPROACH A CHILD OTHER THAN THEIR CHILD TO ADDRESS AN ISSUE AT SCHOOL.
School policy or practice	Contact the office. State nature of concern and make an appointment to see the appropriate member of staff.

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<u>Variation to School Development Days Term 4</u>

The last two days of this year, 19 and 20 December, are scheduled School Development Days. Staff at Broke Public School will be completing these days as time in lieu over 4 twilight professional learning sessions throughout the year. This means our school will be non-operational on 19 and 20 December.

School / Class News

Broke Public School has two classes this year, the K-2 Kangaroos and the 3-6 Wallabies. To provide students with a broad and balanced education, the curriculum is defined in terms of Key Learning Areas (KLAs). Public schools have implemented syllabuses in English, mathematics, science and technology, history, geography, PD/H/PE and creative arts. This year, Broke Public School will be implementing new curriculum and units of work for English and maths K-6. Support and extension programs will be put in place for students who require them.

K-2 Kangaroos with Mrs Aalto and Miss Ball

Welcome to our new class for 2024, the K-2 Kangaroos! We have 8 students with a split of 2 boys and 6 girls.

<u>English</u>: In English this term students will build a strong foundation of listening to and recording individual sounds in words. Students will make connections between their personal experiences and stories as we look at imaginative texts. They will learn about the world around them and sequence events in order when writing recounts. We will be working on writing descriptions of people, places and things. Students will learn about how authors write from their own context and experiences and how the language in texts varies depending on the purpose and audience.

<u>Maths</u>: In mathematics this term students will develop their knowledge and understanding of sorting objects depending on their attributes, combining and separating groups of objects, two dimensional shapes and representing data. We will also be looking closely at patterns, representing whole numbers and forming groups of objects. Later in the term we will look at measurement including lengths, area, volume and mass. Students will explore 2D shapes and 3D objects as they explore how combining and breaking apart existing shapes can create new ones.

<u>Creative Arts</u>: Creative Arts will be taught by Miss Ball on Mondays. In creative arts this term students will look at making visual artworks by experimenting with a range of different media. Through the theme of 'imagination', students will learn to develop their artistic intentions in artmaking and consider how these affect the look of the artwork, its details and an audience's response. They will and explore artists intention when making of artworks, and interpret the meaning of artworks, taking into account relationships between the artwork, the world and the artist.

<u>Personal Development, Health and Physical Education</u>: PDHPE will be taught by Mrs Miskin during RFF on Wednesdays. Whole class sport and whole school sport sessions will also take place weekly. All students will complete 150 minutes of vigorous physical activity per week. This may take the form of fitness, PE, sport or in class learning.

Science and Technology, History, Geography: Science and technology and geography will be taught side by side using STEM learning this term. STEM learning involves students identifying real life problems, brainstorming and designing solutions, making and testing solutions, and presenting solutions to an audience. In the science component, students will explore the Living World and combine it with local places. Our unit focuses on the characteristics, features, growth and survival of living things and how they adapt over time to suit their environment. 3-6 Wallabies with Miss Anderiesen and Miss Ball

Welcome to our new class for 2024, the 3-6 Wallabies! There are 14 students in the Wallabies class.

English: Read, Write and Think rotations will take place each morning, as well as explicit modelled, guided and independent English lessons. English activities include reading, writing and speaking and listening. We would appreciate you encouraging your child to do some form of reading every single night, especially reading for enjoyment!

<u>Maths</u>: Maths lessons include modelled, guided and independent activities in number and algebra, measurement and geometry and statistics and probability. Skills in Working Mathematically will be embedded throughout all units of learning. Students in Year 3 should be beginning to instantly recall multiplication facts including 2X, 3X, 5X and 10X, if they cannot already, moving into facts up to 10X by the end of Year 4, and 12X by the end of Year 6. We would appreciate you encouraging your child to practise times tables at home. There are a number of free games available on the Internet to make this more exciting. Daily number work will also be completed at school.

<u>Creative Arts</u>: Creative Arts will be taught by Miss Ball on Wednesdays. In creative arts this term students will look at making visual artworks by experimenting with a range of different media. Through the theme of 'imagination', students will learn to develop their artistic intentions in artmaking and consider how these affect the look of the artwork, its details and an audience's response. They will and explore artists intention when making of artworks, and interpret the meaning of artworks, taking into account relationships between the artwork, the world and the artist.

<u>Personal Development, Health and Physical Education:</u> PDHPE will be taught by Mrs Miskin during RFF on Tuesdays. Whole class sport and whole school sport sessions will also take place

weekly. All students will complete 150 minutes of vigorous physical activity per week. This may take the form of fitness, PE, sport or in class learning.

K-6 Library with Miss Ball

In library this term, all students K-6 will be exploring books that address the theme of sustainability. They will learn about and use the Super Six Comprehension Strategies to unpack meaning in texts and explore author's intention through language choices. Students will also learn about libraries and library systems and establish good habits when reading and borrowing books. They will engage with opportunities to use digital technologies as sources of information.

PDHPE with Mrs Miskin

K-2 Kangaroos

In PDH, the Kangaroos will be participating in a social and emotional unit, focusing on listening skills, safe hands and feet, playing games involving others and learning to give and receive compliments.

In PE the students will be learning and developing their fundamental movement skills, including non-locomotive skills. Each movement will be explicitly demonstrated, practised and then developed in a game.

3-6 Wallabies

In PDH, the unit for the Wallabies students, focuses on resilience. This topic will empower students to develop resilience that can support them to respond positively to different situations. In PE the students will continue to develop and master their fundamental movement skills. Students are refining their techniques and linking them to the games and sports they love to play.

Assistant Principal Curriculum and Instruction - Mrs Cook

As the Assistant Principal, Curriculum and Instruction, I will be working closely with teachers to enhance literacy and numeracy skills. My goal is to strengthen teaching practices and student learning experiences across all grades. By collaborating with teachers, I aim to create a supportive environment that fosters academic growth and success for your child. I will be working in the classrooms with teachers as well as working with Miss Ball to identify areas where we can make improvements and strengthen the teaching and learning across K-6.

Wombats Preschool with Miss Fahey

Our Wombats preschool program runs in collaboration with Dubbo School of Distance Education. Students share in online sessions with the team at Dubbo daily, learning how to communicate effectively and enjoying fun learning activities. These activities are complimented by the engaging, play-based activities run by our Early Childhood Education Teacher, Miss Fahey. Students have been spending time getting to know their new friends at Broke. They have been busy learning nursery rhymes and sequencing stories they tell. There's been lots of art and craft as well as structured play. Lego and imaginative play have been very popular, especially making Miss Fahey coffees on the wooden coffee machine! Our Wombats participate in cooking, technology and lots of outdoor activities, giving them well rounded experiences in learning.


ICT (Information and Communication Technology)

ICT will be integrated throughout all KLAs. All our classrooms have interactive whiteboards. Throughout the year, students will be engaged in using iPads, laptops, video conferencing, the creation of movies and digital stories, as well as a range of other technology-based activities involving equipment such as Spheros, 3D printers, Microbits and Bluebots.

Each student has a personal email account with the Department of Education (DoE), which can be accessed both at school and at home through the DoE portal. Internet safety is something our school takes very seriously. Responsibilities and rules for safe computer use will be discussed with students and any misdemeanors could result in a student's password being changed so they cannot access their DoE account.

Mobile phones should be registered at the front office each day they are brought to school and can be collected in the afternoon. No other electrical equipment is permitted. This includes Smart watches.

PBL News

Broke Public School is a PBL (Positive Behaviour for Learning) school. Our school expectations are Safe, Respectful, Responsible, Learner. Our school mascot is Beardy, the bearded dragon. Students earn Cricket Tickets for displaying behaviours that meet our school expectations. These Cricket Tickets can be traded for rewards at the end of each term. Students are encouraged to use the High Five strategies if they are experiencing problems at school. Lessons on the High Five strategies and PBL expectations are explicitly taught to students from preschool to Year 6 throughout the year.
